Phase 6 Phonics

Helping your child's phonics
progress at home

Phonics games and ideas

Letters and Sounds

Phase 6 introduces no new phonemes for children to learn. At this stage children should be able to spell words using the phonics they already have, even if they are not always correct.

In Phase Six the main aim is for children to become more fluent readers and more accurate spellers.

Stepping stones

Line up 2, 3 or 4 "stepping stones" each with a letter sound on. Step from each stone to the next saying the sounds as you go. When you get to the end, blend the sounds together and see what word was created.



Phoneme necklaces

Use a felt tip to write letter sounds on the side of pasta tubes then string them together to make word necklaces.

Tricky word Snakes and Ladders

Make some cards of the Phase 5 tricky words for reading. Play a regular game of Snakes and Ladders *but* in order to go up a ladder you must read a tricky word correctly.

Chalks and painting

Chalk letter sounds around your garden or paint them inside on a rainy day.

Sprint sounds



Encourage instant recognition with this simple running game:

- Stick up a variety of letter sound posters around the garden or playground.
- Call out a sound and your child sprints to the correct poster.
- Reverse the game and have your child call out sounds for you to sprint to!

Pairs

Create cards with letter sounds that have different spellings but the same sound, e.g. ai and ay. Shuffle the cards, place them face down and try to find pairs of sounds.
